# Yellow Marquee

## 7.00 - 7.30pm Informal Talk, Q&A - Sorrow Songs – Angeline Morrison.

Angeline Morrison released her first album on the Topic record label last year.

The Sorrow Songs was recorded in Cornwall at Cube Studios and is a work of what Angeline calls 're-storying': "The traditional songs of the UK are rich with storytelling, and you can find songs with examples of almost any kind of situation or person you can think of. But whilst people of the African diaspora have been present in these islands since at least Roman times, their histories are little known – and these histories don't tend to appear in the folk songs of these islands."

Angeline began to wonder if she could discover more about the lives of these ordinary and extraordinary Black ancestors, and create an album of songs in the sonic style of UK folk and traditional music, in the hope that this silent space could then begin to be filled with stories. With the help of Arts Council National Lottery funding, Angeline began what became a year of research into this neglected area of Black British history. The Sorrow Songs: Folk Songs of Black British Experience is the result.

Angeline will talk and sing you through her journey. Drop-in session.

#### 8.45 - 9.30pm Talk & Demonstration 800 Years of Music - Andy Casserley.

"800 Years of Music", an illustrative talk by Andy Casserley tracing the evolution of musical instruments and songs from the 12th century to modern times.
